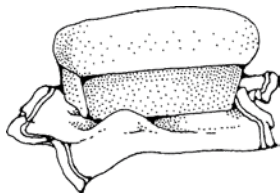

MOM'S ZUCCHINI BREAD

Yields 2 loafs

- 3 cups all purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon salt (optional)
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 Tablespoon ground cinnamon
- 3 eggs
- 1 cup vegetable oil
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 2 ¼ cups white sugar
- 3 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 2 cups grated zucchini
- 1 cup chopped walnuts (optional)



1. Grease and flour 2, 8x4 inch pans. Preheat oven to 325 degrees.
2. Sift flour, salt, baking soda, baking powder and cinnamon together in bowl.
3. In large bowl, beat eggs, oil, vanilla & sugar together. Add sifted ingredients to the creamed mixture and beat well. Stir in zucchini and nuts until well combined. Pour into prepared pans.
4. Bake for 40 to 60 minutes, or until tester inserted in the center comes out clean. Cool in pan 20 minutes. Remove bread from pan and cool completely.

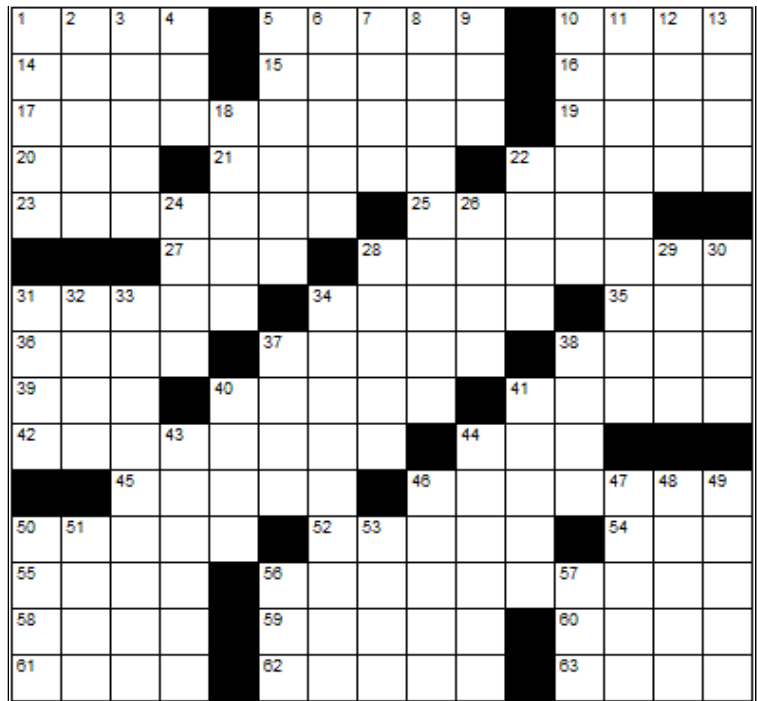
