

TWICE BAKED POTATO CASSEROLE

1 hr. 30 mins 10 servings



8 medium potatoes

3 tbs canola oil

 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb bacon

2 sticks of salted butter, softened to room temperature & sliced into cubes

1 cup sour cream, room temperature

1 cup whole milk, room temperature

2 cups cheddar cheese, plus more for serving, grated

2 tsp seasoned salt

Salt, to taste

Pepper, to taste

3 green onions, optional, sliced

Preheat oven to 400 degrees; lightly grease a 9x13 inch baking dish; wash potatoes and wipe dry; rub the potatoes with canola oil. Place potatoes on a baking sheet and bake until they are tender and easily cut through; in a large skillet, cook the bacon.

Remove potatoes, allowing them to cool; lower the oven temperature to 350 degrees; leave the skins on 2 of the potatoes; peel and discard the skins from the remaining 6 potatoes; cut all potatoes into thirds, add them to a large mixing bowl; crumble the bacon and set some aside for topping the casserole.

Add the remaining crumbled bacon, butter, sour cream, milk, cheese, seasoned salt, salt and pepper to the cut potatoes; smash the potato mixture with a potato masher until well combined and creamy; add the mashed potato mixture to the prepared baking dish; top the casserole with the reserved bacon and the remaining 1 cup of cheese.

Bake, uncovered, until heated through and the cheese has melted, about 20-25 minutes; serve with green onions and grated cheese.



- 1. Trash must be in bags and securely tied.




