

#### ENCROACHING DEVELOPMENTS – OLD AND NEW

This is by no means a complete summary and is intended for your general information only.

Since last April, and our commitment to our residents, I have been keeping track of the Emerald Creek development neighboring us to the north. There has been little progress. As previously mentioned at our General meetings, the engineer's preliminary drainage and grading design is scheduled for the end of the year. There is now a for sale sign posted for this property. The only part of the property that is for sale are the 7 acres commercial portion on the corner of 19 and Centralia.

Over the last couple of months, I found 3 additional approved developments, not including 'The Lagoon', off Bourassa Blvd., that are not adjacent to us, but are close by and will affect traffic and land use. This is what I know about each so far.

- 1. Crystal Waters Corner of Commercial Way (19) & Bourassa Blvd., south side: Total 128 acres with a 430'x220' (3.5 ac.) commercial portion at the corner and approximately 222 high-density singlefamily residents, 40' wide lots, county water/sewer. Accessible from 19 and Bourassa.
- 2. Glen Lakes Development South of Crystal Waters and across from Glen Lakes: Total 19 acres commercial use with mini-warehouse storage and a tire/ auto accessory establishment. Accessible from 19.
- 3. Lake Mirage Corner of Atlanta Ave. and Eakin Street (behind the new Winding Oaks) now in construction: Total 54 acres with 136 single-family homes, 60' to 80' wide lots, 7,700 sq. ft. to 10,000 sq. ft. lots, on county water/sewer, no age restriction, no 'affordable' housing. Accessible from Atlanta Ave. and Hexam Road via existing side roads.


No Plan B by Lee Child. A series of crimes are part of something bigger. Jack Reacher steps in to solve the case.



#### Identity Theft

#### Warning signs of identity theft

- Bills for items you did not buy
- Debt collection calls for accounts you did not open
- Information on your credit report for accounts you did not open
- Denials of loan applications
- Mail stops coming to, or is missing from, your mailbox

#### How to report identity theft

- To report identity theft, contact:
- The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) online at IdentityTheft.gov or call 1-877-438-4338
- The three major credit reporting agencies. Ask them to place fraud alerts and a credit freeze on your accounts.
- The fraud department at your credit card issuers, bank, and other places where you have accounts

#### How to protect yourself from identity theft

- Do not answer phone calls, texts, social media messages, or email from numbers or people you do not know.
- Do not share personal information like your bank account number, Social Security number, or date of birth.
- **Collect your mail every day** and place a hold on your mail when you will be on vacation or away from your home.
- Review credit card and bank account statements. Watch for and report unauthorized or suspicious transactions.
- Understand how ATM skimming works and how to protect yourself
- Learn when it is safe to use a public Wi-Fi network
- Store personal information, including your Social Security card, in a safe place. Do not carry it in your wallet.

**Imposter Scam** 

ALERT

#### The top types of imposter scams:

An imposter scammer may call, text, or email to convince you they are someone in authority. They may even use caller ID to make it look like they are calling from an official government or business' number. To commit identity theft, they try to get you to send money or a gift card or share personal information.

- **Government** imposter scams Unless you contact them first, government agencies typically initiate communication with you by letter. Unexpected contact or demands through any other method may be a scam.
- IRS imposter scams scammers pretend you owe the IRS money for taxes and may threaten legal action
- Social Security imposter scams scammers claim there is a problem with your Social Security account or promise to increase your benefits
- Charity scams scammers pretend to be from a real or fake charity and try to get you to contribute
- Grandparent scams scammers pretend to be a grandchild or other relative who needs emergency financial help
- Tech support scams scammers tell you your computer's security is at risk and try to remotely access your device and steal personal information or ask for payment
- Scammers may also pretend to be from your bank or a company you do business with. You might be told you owe money or there is a problem with your account.


