2024 6-MONTH EVENT SUMMARY

From the HOA Treasury Department

While preparing for the 2nd quarter audit, I thought it would be interesting to breakout and summarize the event profits. Donations, if any, are also being tracked, for I believe the 1st time. For each event, the Activities' Committee provides the Board with a budget for approval, along with the ticket price, and an estimated number of attendees. So far this year, the actual cost is 2.6% below the requested budget. HOWEVER, this does not include a large number of donations. Net income to June 20, 2024, is \$605.00. This number DOES INCLUDE the \$600.00 of food, needed materials, or money donations. The majority of the donations are from the Activities Committee, with residents also making donations. Without these donations, the HOA would be losing money. Not only does the Activities Committee spend countless hours producing our events, but without their generosity, and the donations of residents, we would not be able to host very many, if any, events.

It is important to remember, the purpose of most events is as a fund-raiser to support the free events, and keep ticket prices for the large or special events as low as possible. Looking at the attendance numbers, only a small number of residents are supporting the Activities Committee's efforts, with many more simply taking advantage of others' hard work and dedication. So, the next time you or anyone thinks the cost of an HOA event is too high, think again, thank the Activities Committee, support the events, or better yet, volunteer or be one of the generous residents that donate.

SPAGHETTI AND PEPPERONI CASSEROLE

When you're up for something different



Preheat oven to 400 degrees Spray 8x8 baking pan with nonstick cooking spray

 $\frac{1}{2}$ container with Alfredo Sauce (15 oz.) or your favorite red sauce will do

1 ½ tablespoon parmesan cheese, grated

1 1/2 tablespoon Romano, grated

½ cup mozzarella cheese, shredded

1 ½ cups pepperoni, slice and cut in quarters

1/4 cup pepperoni, sliced

1 cup roasted red bell pepper slices (jarred)

2 cups cooked spaghetti. (boil spaghetti for 1 minute and drain well)

SPRAY pan with nonstick cooking spray; spread sauce (your choice) on the bottom of pan. MEASURE out cheeses, pepperoni and roasted peppers. BOIL spaghetti for 1 minute and drain well. PLACE spaghetti in large bowl, add sauce, pepperoni, peppers, Parmesan and Romano, mix well. Place in an 8x8 baking pan. TOP with mozzarella and whole slice pepperoni. BAKE uncovered for 35 minutes. COOK'S TIP: you may use turkey pepperoni or sausage, add ground beef, mushrooms, sundried tomatoes, spinach, olives or zucchini. ENJOY!







Identity Theft

Warning signs of identity theft

- · Bills for items you did not buy
- Debt collection calls for accounts you did not open
- · Information on your credit report for accounts you did not open
- · Denials of loan applications
- · Mail stops coming to, or is missing from, your mailbox

How to report identity theft

To report identity theft, contact:

- The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) online at IdentityTheft.gov or call 1-877-438-4338
- The three major credit reporting agencies. Ask them to place fraud alerts and a credit freeze on your accounts.
- The fraud department at your credit card issuers, bank, and other places where you have accounts

How to protect yourself from identity theft

- Do not answer phone calls, texts, social media messages, or email from numbers or people you do not know.
- · Do not share personal information like your bank account number, Social Security number, or date of birth.
- · Collect your mail every day and place a hold on your mail when you will be on vacation or away from your home.
- Review credit card and bank account statements. Watch for and report unauthorized or suspicious transactions.
- Understand how ATM skimming works and how to protect yourself
- · Learn when it is safe to use a public Wi-Fi network
- · Store personal information, including your Social Security card, in a safe place. Do not carry it in your wallet.

Imposter Scam

The top types of imposter scams:

An imposter scammer may call, text, or email to convince you they are **someone in authority**. They may even use caller ID to make it look like they are calling from an official government or business' number. To commit identity theft, they try to get you to send money or a gift card or share personal information.

- · Government imposter scams Unless you contact them first, government agencies typically initiate communication with you by letter. Unexpected contact or demands through any other method may be a scam.
- IRS imposter scams scammers pretend you owe the IRS money for taxes and may threaten legal action
- Social Security imposter scams scammers claim there is a problem with your Social Security account or promise to increase
- Charity scams scammers pretend to be from a real or fake charity and try to get you to contribute
- Grandparent scams scammers pretend to be a grandchild or other relative who needs emergency financial help
- Tech support scams scammers tell you your computer's security is at risk and try to remotely access your device and steal personal information or ask for payment
- Scammers may also pretend to be from your bank or a company you do business with. You might be told you owe money or there is a problem with your account.
