

NOTES FROM THE FRONT OFFICE

Water Use and Saving Tips for Residents

1 Bath = 42 gallons

- 30 Baths = 1,260 gallons30 Showers = 510 gallons
- 1 Shower = 17 gallons 1 Laundry Load = 45 gallons
- 1 Toilet Flush = 5 gallons
- s 20 Laundry Loads = 900 gallons
 - 10 Flushes/day = 1,500 gallons

No cost, very little effort to do:

- Take shorter showers using a water saving head and save 2.5 gallons per minute*
- Turn off water when shaving and brushing your teeth and save 2 gallons per minute*
- Wait for full loads to wash clothes and save 20 galls per load
- If you own a dishwasher, fill it instead of washing each dish by hand and only run the dishwasher when full and save 2 to 4 galls per load
- Don't let the water run when rinsing dishes, if washing by hand, save 2.5 gallons per minute
- Don't use the toilet as a wastebasket and save 1.6 gallons per flush
- Do not use water sprinklers in the heat of the day and adjust so they do not water sidewalk, driveway and street. Saves up to 500 gallons/month

No or low cost, more effort required:

- Repair dripping faucets by replacing washers. If your faucet is dripping at the rate of one drop per second, you can expect to waste 2,700 gallons per year, which will add to the cost of water and sewer utilities.
- Check for toilet tank leaks by adding food coloring or a dye table to the tank. If the toilet is leaking, color will appear within 30 minutes. Check the toilet for worn out, corroded or bent parts. Most replacement parts are inexpensive, readily available and easily installed. (Flush as soon as test is done since food coloring may stain tank). Fix leaky toilets and save 200 to 2,000 gallons or more per month per toilet.*
- Install low flow shower heads and save 2,700 gallons per year or more*
- Install aerators on all faucets and save 10 to 15 gallons per day*
- Plant drought resistant trees and shrubs



Higher cost, the most effort required:

- Replace your inefficient washer with a High Efficiency Washing Machine and save 25 to 35 gallons per day*
- Replace older toilets with high Efficiency Toilets (HETs) and save 25 gallons per day*
- Check your entire house for drips and repair. Saves several thousand gal./month
 - · 1/32" leak waste 170 gallons in 24 hours
 - · /16" leak waste 600 gallons in 24 hours
 - · 1/8" leak waste 2,500 gallons in 24 hours

*The possible water savings mentioned are estimates and will vary


