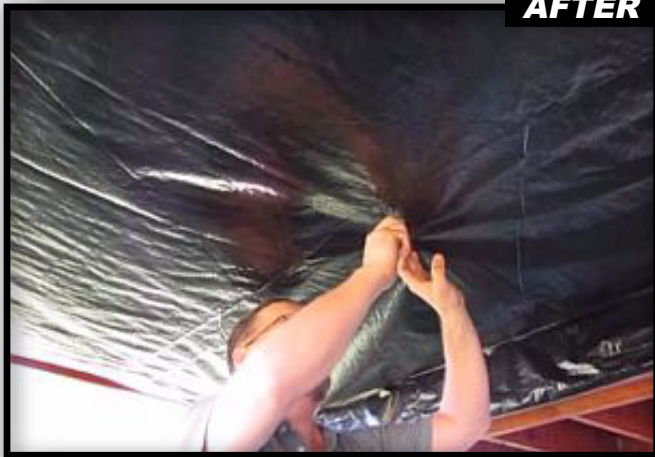

Please come sign storage agreement IF you have items in storage, even kayaks. Full time residents and snowbirds alike. If you're able to, please park all of your items next to each other.

- Please make sure you report all incidents to management. I can't help you if I don't know about your concerns.

TRASH PICK-UP GUIDELINES

- Trash must be at curbside by 9 AM on Mondays and Thursdays
- Changes due to Holiday schedule will be posted in advance at the Community bulletin boards

TRASH

1. All household trash must be in **plastic bags and securely tied**
2. Please do not overload bags, it causes tearing
3. All yard debris must be placed in cans or bags and **NOT** loose on the curbside. We have extra cans you may borrow to fill; just call the office and we will deliver and pick-up when filled.

RECYCLING



1. No glass
2. Please place all recycled products curbside on garbage days and separate as follows:
 - Cardboard (must be broken down and flattened)
 - Aluminum Cans (Tuesday curbside) this does not include soup or vegetable cans, these are tin and only aluminum ones are recycled.
3. Plastic is not recycled, it is bagged and disposed of as trash. Do not place plastic items with the aluminum cans.

PLEASE Do Not place Cardboard, Furniture, Mattresses, Box Springs, Toilets, TV's & Appliances, Old flooring & Carpet or any LARGE items in or near the Dumpsters. You Must Dispose of these items Yourself at the County Waste/Dump Locations or see management for large item trash agreement removal and fee. Our trash collection service does not take those items because it damages their compactor. In about November the park will do the big dumpsters again for most bigger items. November 8th, Management will have dumpsters brought in for all the large and all other items not recycled or allowed in the normal dumpsters. If not sure what you can dump, contact the office.

SPEEDING IN THE PARK

We would like to remind people to watch your speed in the park. You are being watched. Whether you are in a car or a golf cart, there is a 15-mph limit for a reason. The speed limit is not a suggestion; it is an important rule for safety. We have a lot of people in a small area who walk, some use walkers, some walk their dogs. There have been a lot of close calls of people almost hit. Take your time and stop at all stop signs.

Fuel Pump Skimming

Skimming occurs when devices illegally installed on ATMs, point-of-sale (POS) terminals, or fuel pumps capture data or record cardholders' PINs. Criminals use the data to create fake debit or credit cards and then steal from victims' accounts.

Tips When Using a Fuel Pump

- Choose a fuel pump that is **closer to the store** and in direct view of the attendant. These pumps are less likely to be targets for skimmers.
- **Run your debit card as a credit card.** If that's not an option, cover the keypad when you enter your PIN.
- **Consider paying inside** with the attendant, not outside at the pump.

If you think you've been a victim of skimming, contact your financial institution immediately.
